Donation items for Shebang! We are looking for nice, quality items for our live auction, silent auction, and bucket auction for our annual fundraiser celebration on September 29th! Call the Museum if you have something that fits the bill!





This month we will start construction on our two new West Wing permanent exhibit halls: the Western Heritage Hall and the Leathergoods Industry Hall. Thanks to grant money received, we will hopefully be able to finish the preliminary construction work by the end of this year, and begin building out the actual exhibits by January 2019! Our first phase of construction will be: (1) construct an emergency exit, (2) sheetrock work, (3) electrical and alarm system work, (4) textured concrete overlay on the floor, (5) a new overhead lighting grid, and lastly (6) removal of our temporary wall between the Native American Hall and the new wing. This will allow for construction of a permanent half wall for exhibits and a new tipi entrance way.

We are also applying for additional grant monies to help pay for the exhibit construction on the Chisholm Trail, small towns in Montague County, the coming of the railroads, and the many leathergoods manufacturers that once called Nocona home! However we still need more support from our members and community businesses and groups, so we will gladly welcome any and all monetary contributions!
